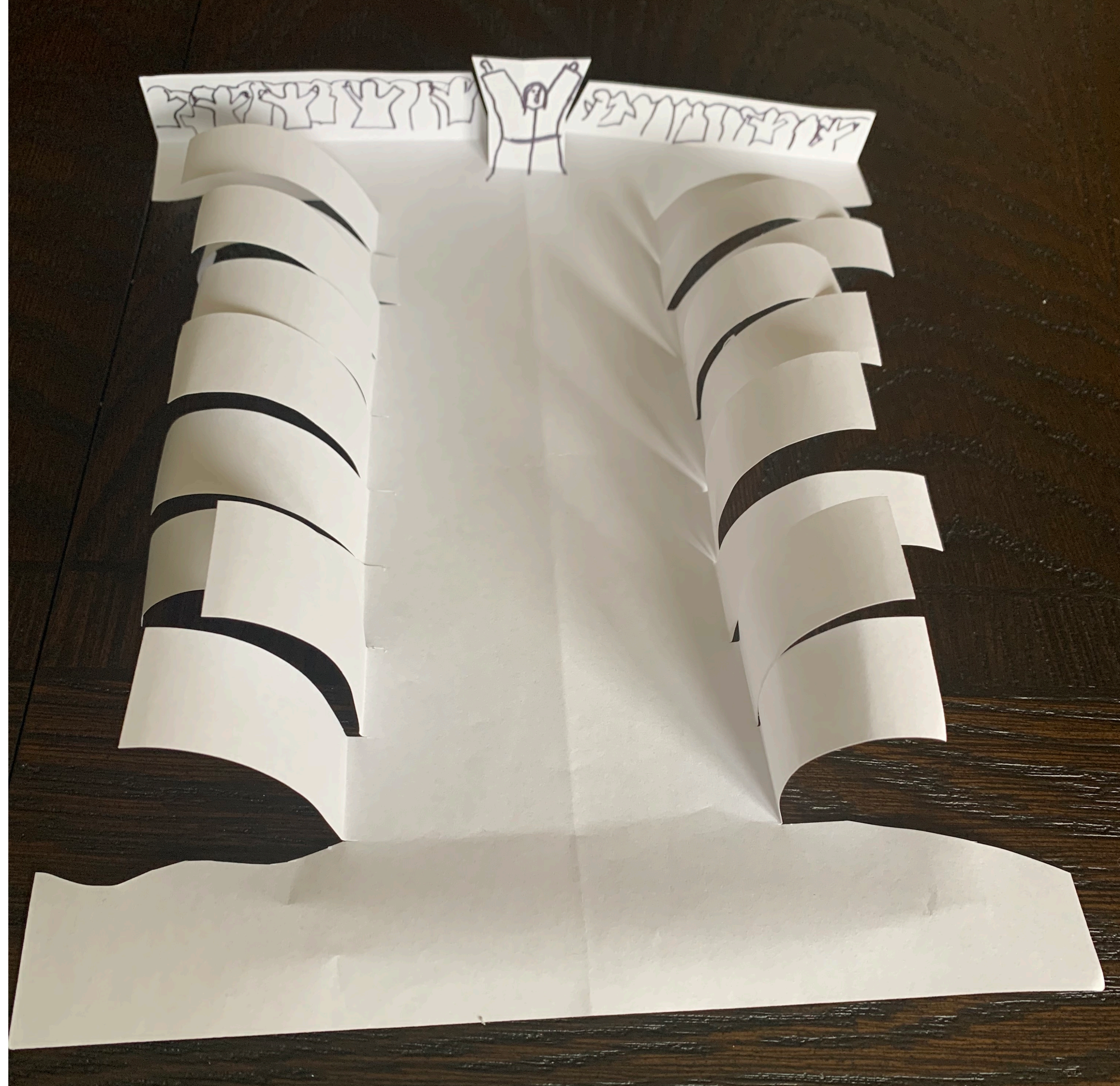


# **Moses Craft-Version 3**

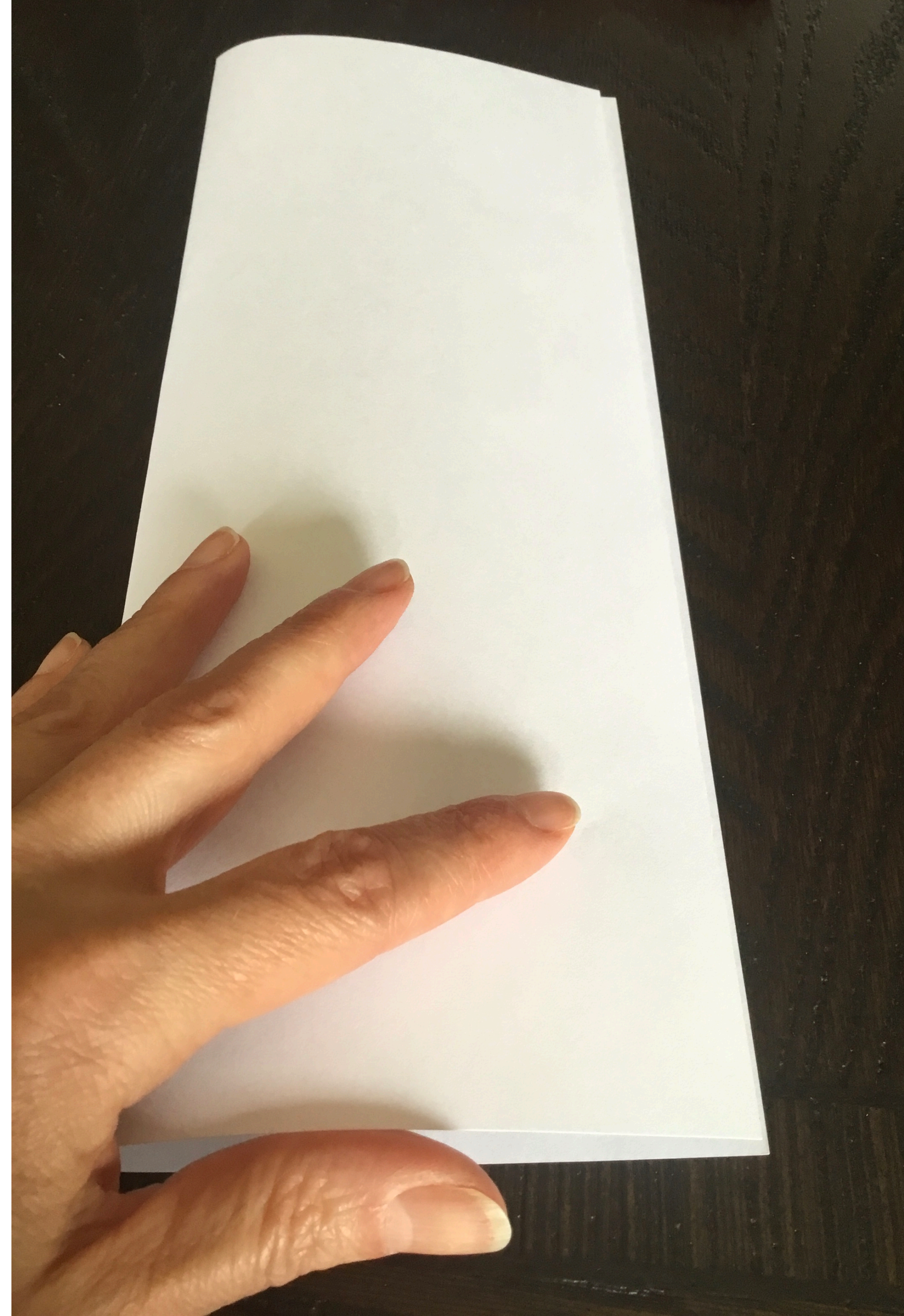

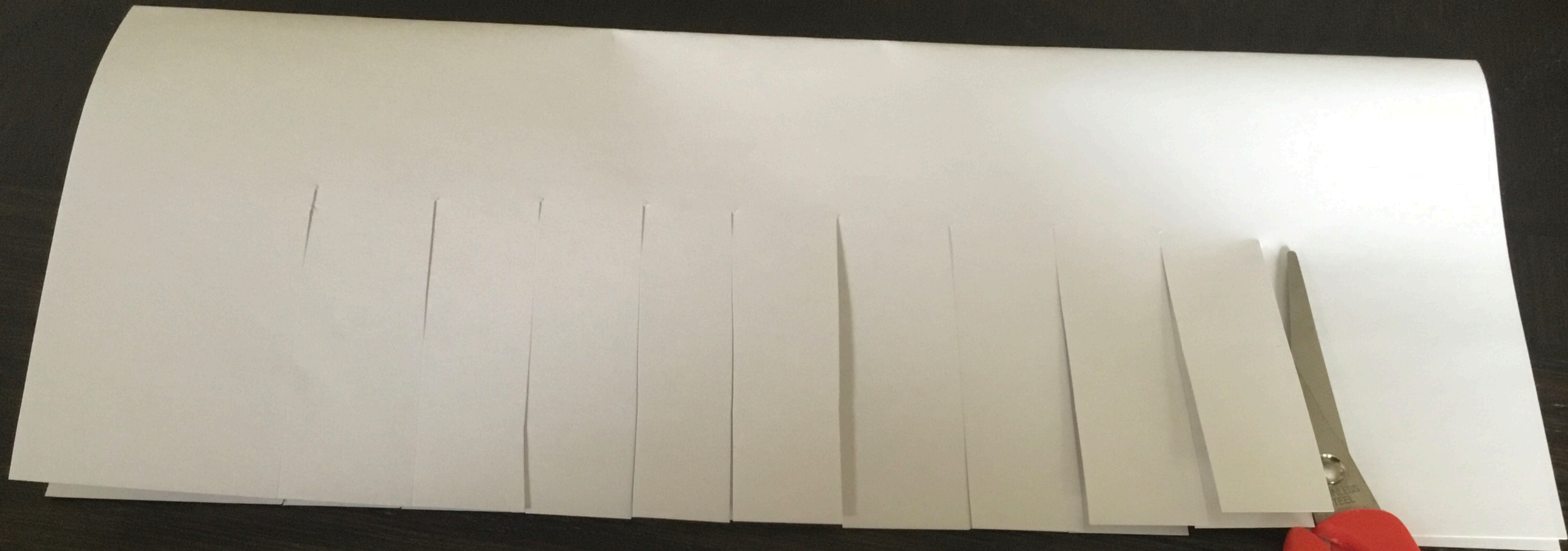
**Materials: A4 paper, scissors, marker.**

**Start with folding  
the paper the  
long skinny way.**






**Make fringe cuts about halfway up from the two paper edges. (Not the crease)**

**Leave 4cm uncut on the two ends.  
So you are only cutting in the middle.**



**See?**  
**-4cm—**



**Other  
end too!  
—4cm—**

**After cutting of fringe is done,  
open it up and lay it on the table.**



except for the 4cm end pieces.**



**When done with all on one side....**



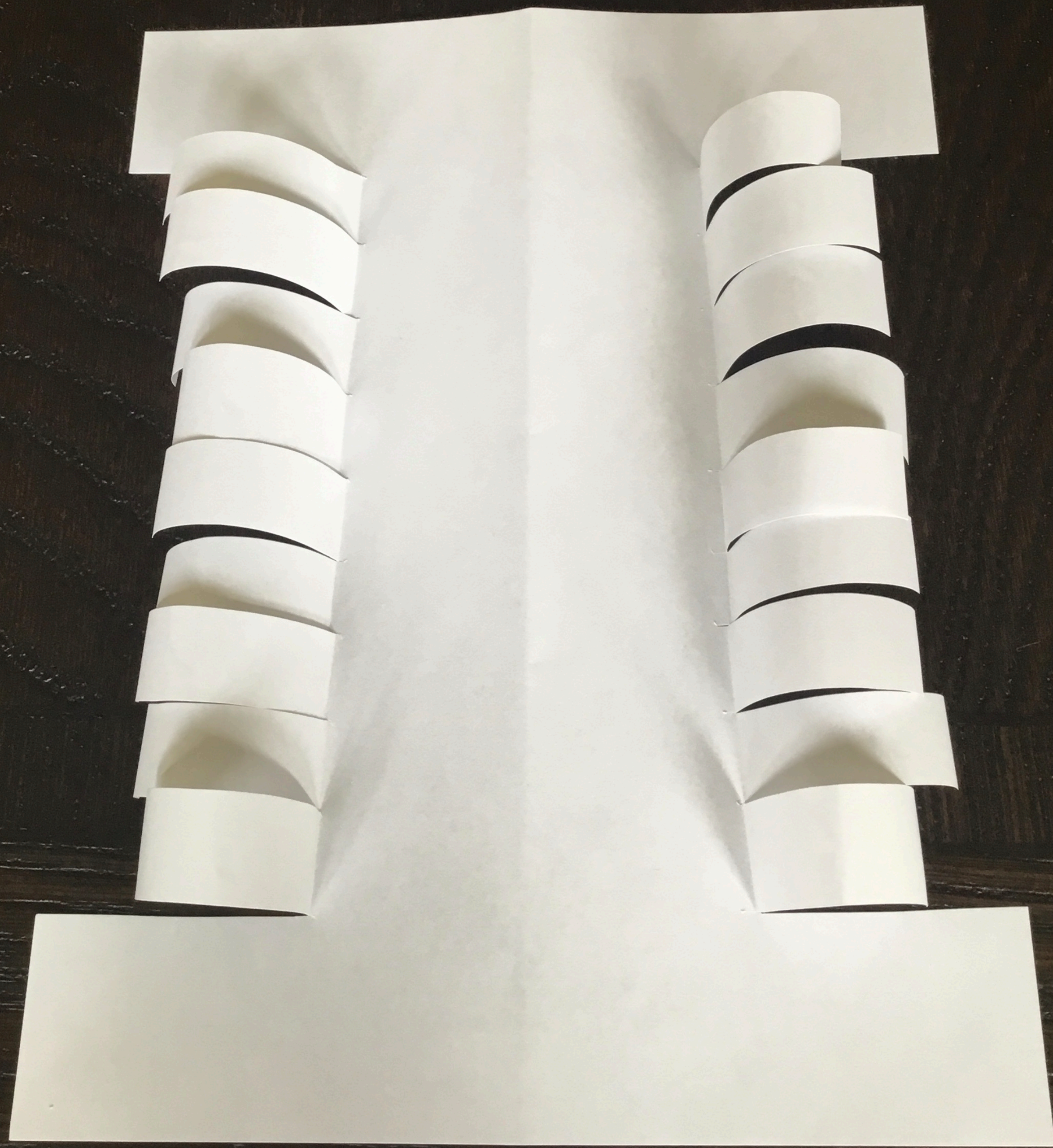
**Stand them all up like

**Yayyyyyy!!**

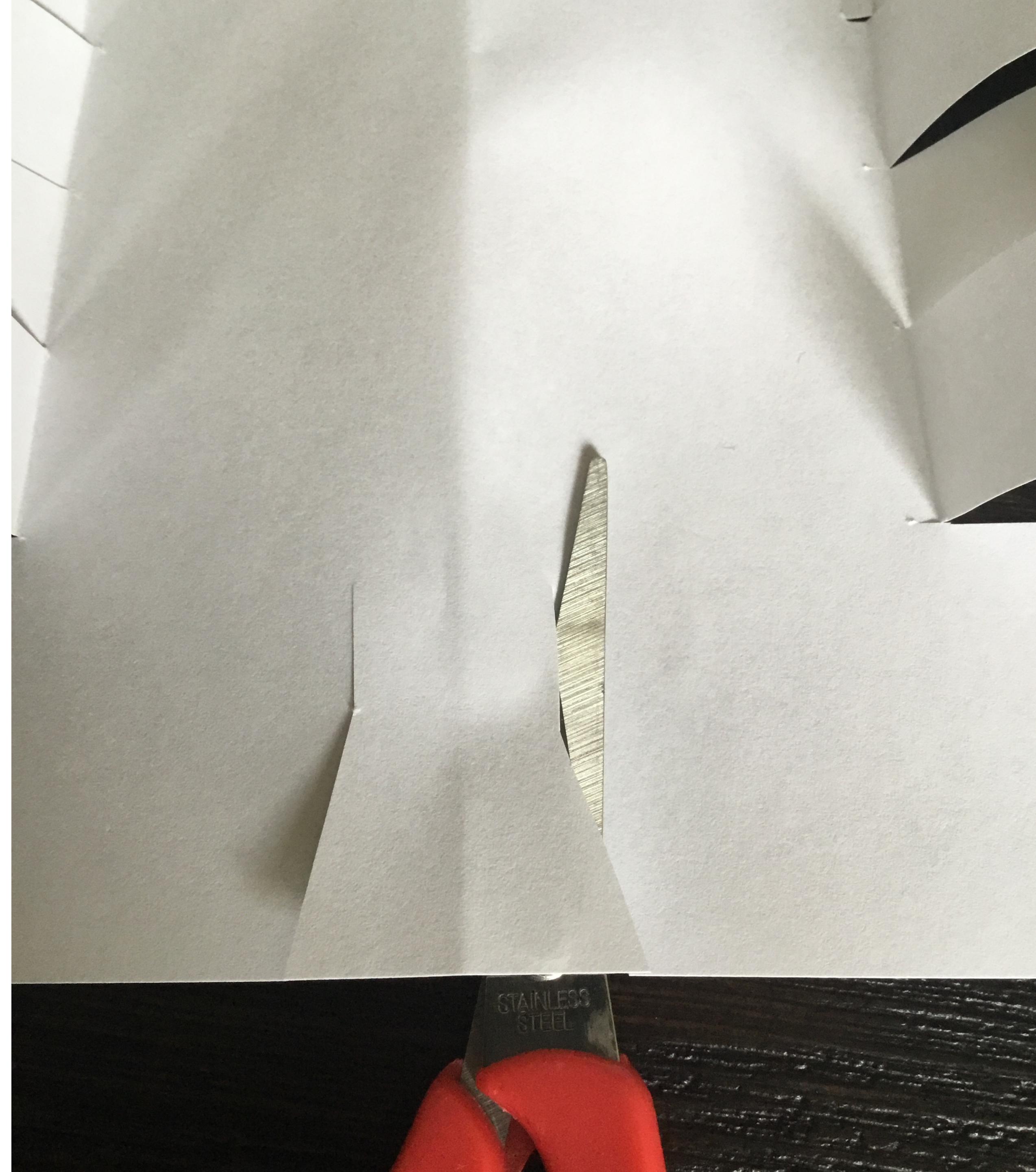



**Curl all the  
standing fringes  
by rolling them  
around a pencil  
outward. Waves!!  
I did one at a  
time.**



**On one end  
make two  
diagonal cuts  
about 2cm long.**

**Then continue  
each cut going  
straight for  
another 1cm  
and stop  
cutting.**



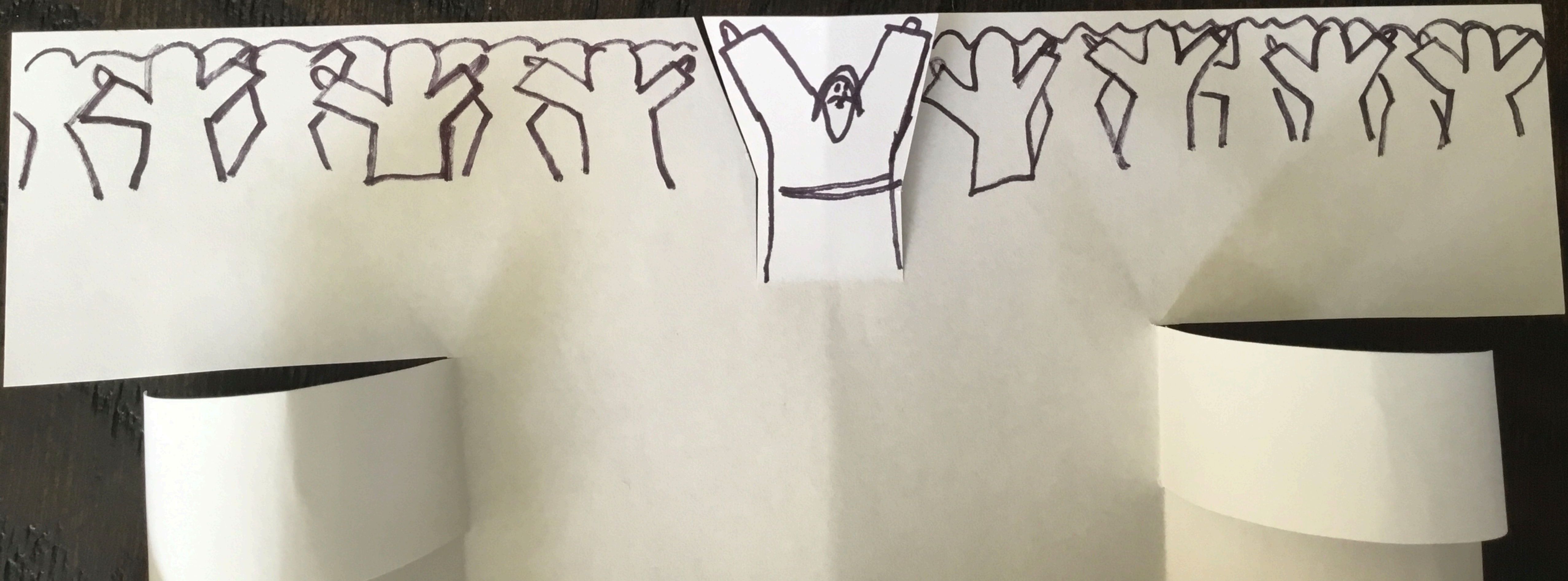


**It will look like this when you  
fold it upward. Turn whole  
thing around and draw Moses.**






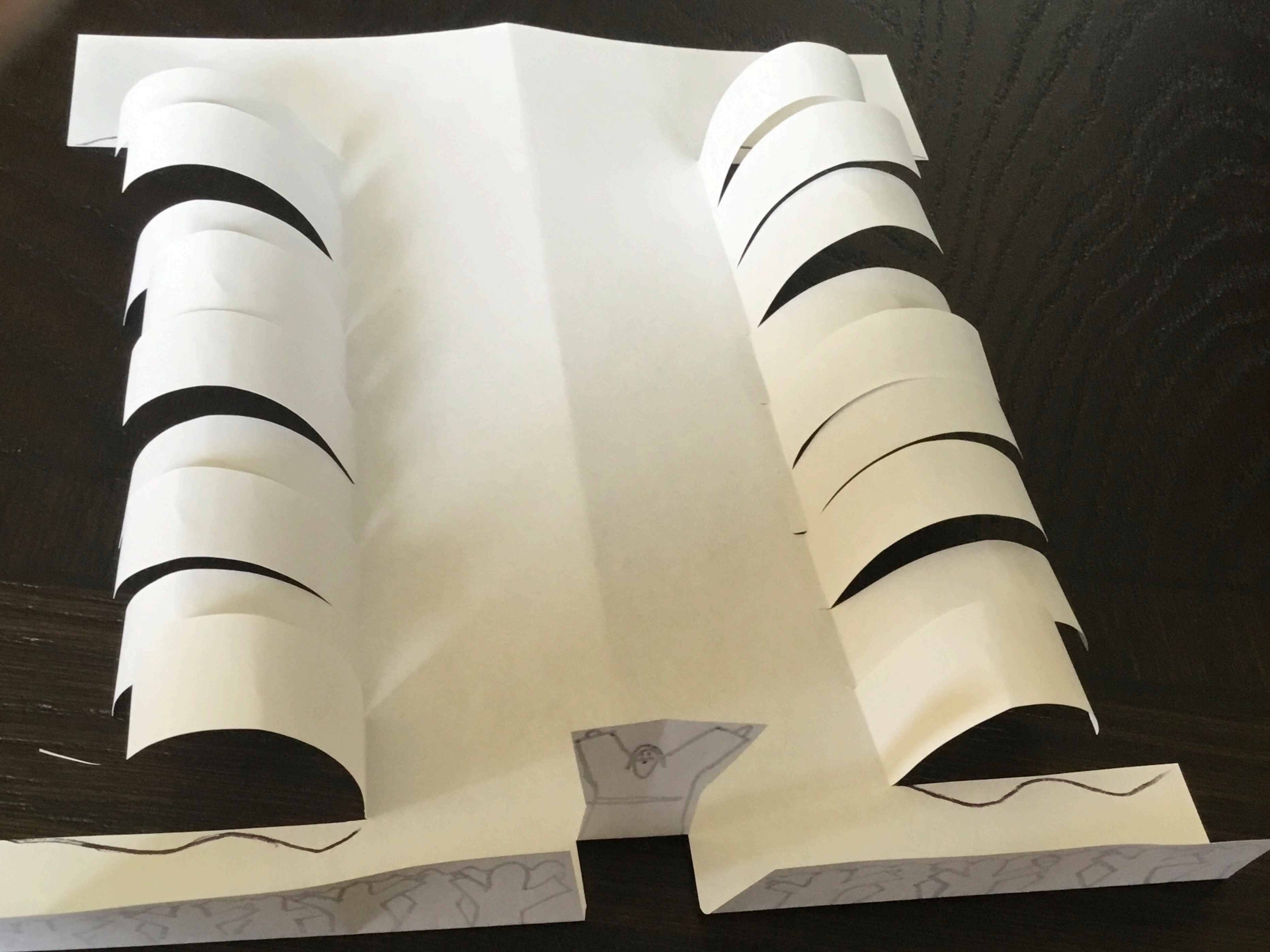
**Also draw  
the top of  
the crowds  
on either  
side.**



**Draw some people in the front of the crowds. Stick people are ok.**

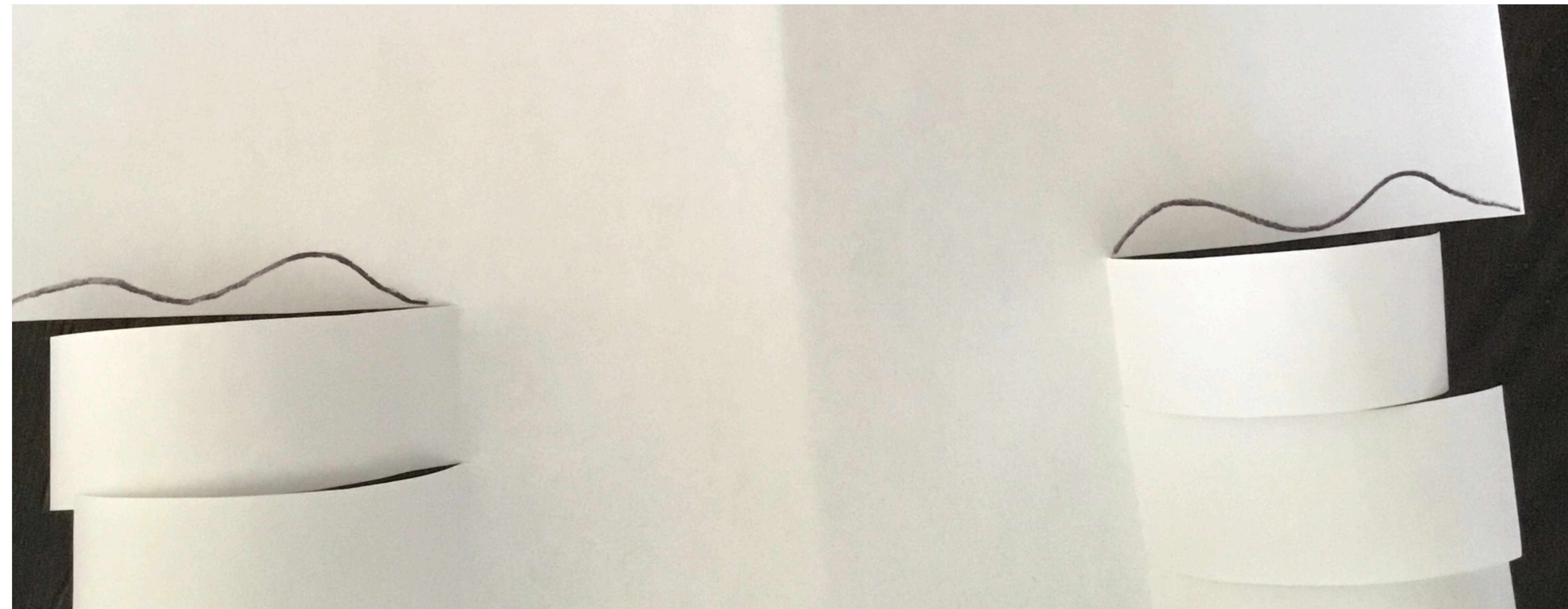



**Fold Moses back up  
and fold the crowds  
up a little behind  
him.**



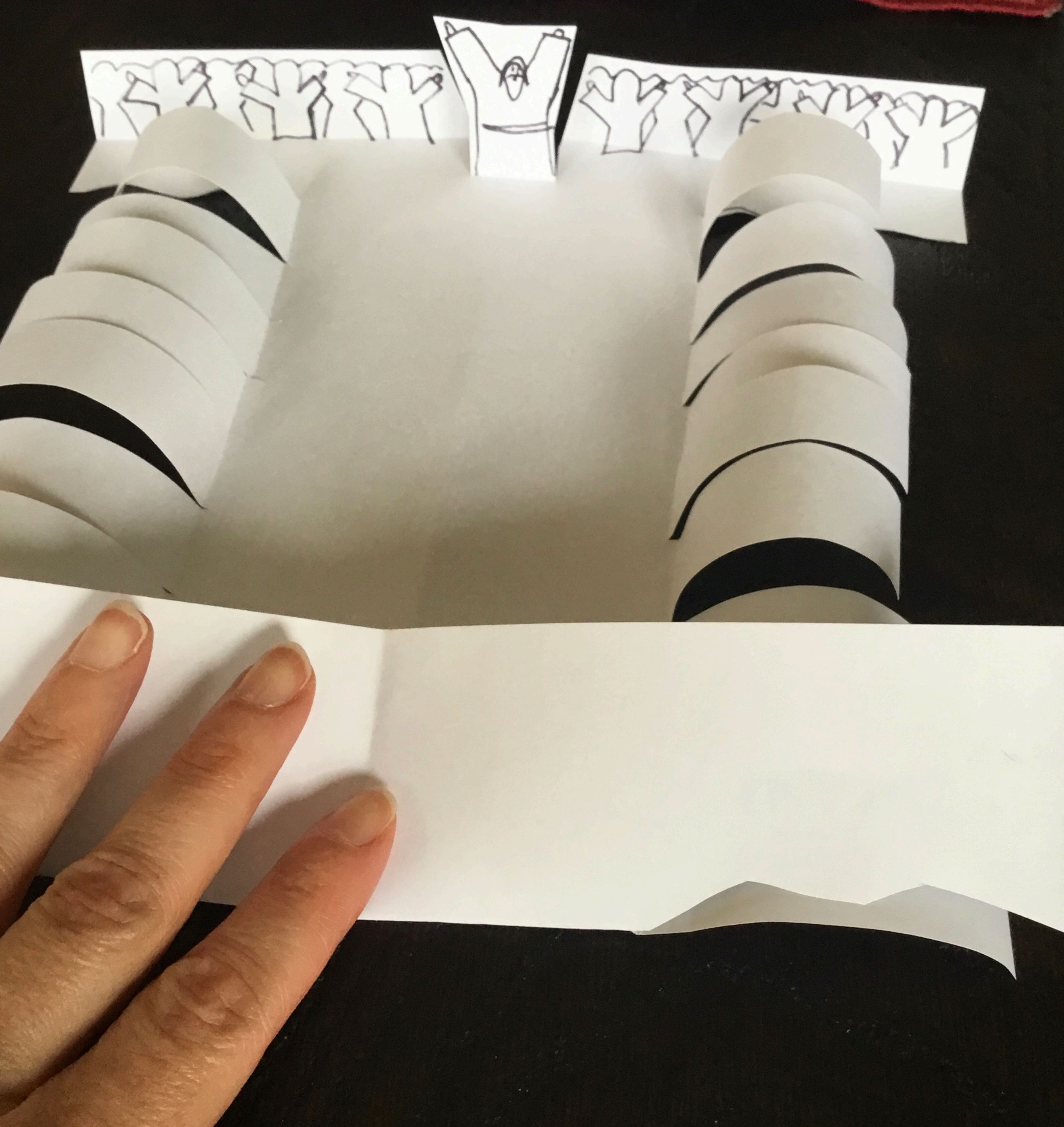
**Another view. Now we will draw the shores. These are cut lines. The wavy lines should meet the bottoms of the waves.**

**Turn piece around to the other shore. Make the wavy lines end at the bottom of the waves there too.**





**Cut all four wavy lines.**



**The far shore  
across from  
Moses gets  
folded  
upward,**



**If you like,  
you can  
roll the  
whole  
shore with  
a pencil so  
it looks  
like a hill.**



**Beautiful!!!!  
You did it!!!!  
Moses says,  
“Behold the  
mighty power  
of God!!!”**
